Have only 24 hours? No problem. With The Sonnenalp's new daycation package— 50-minute spa treatment, 10-minute oxygen bar treatment, lunch at the Bully Ranch (alcohol not included) and a spa-area day pass—you'll definitely feel spoiled.

The lowdown

The Faessler family opened The Sonnenalp in 1979; since then, the luxury alpine hotel has been famed as a hideaway. Still run by the family (there's also a location in Germany), The Sonnenalp has won more than 25 awards for its European

What's nearby

Vail Village, meaning that everything you could want in a mountain town is literally right outside the front door, including world-class restaurants (Kelly Liken, Matsuhisa

and Sweet Basil), boutiques and other luxury hotels housed in 1960era buildings, and Gondola One, which takes passengers to Mid-Vail.

With this daycation package, you'll spend most of your time at the spa-and, after five minutes, wonder how you can move in (we'll let you know when we've got the answer). There's the fireplace lounge area, where you can browse monthly magazines, toast your feet, make friends with other guests or read a book. There are the ultra-comfortable blanket robes. There are the indoor and outdoor hot tubs and an indoor/ outdoor heated pool. There's the fitness room. And there's the spa seradjustments. Our favorite scent: "invigorating" eucalyptus.

Bringing the kids?

They'll have a blast with The Sonnenalp's Kids Club. Catered to children ages 3 to 12, the club offers fun field trips including movie nights, hikes and gondola rides. Tip: If the club knows your kiddos are coming in advance, they'll put together personalized gift bags.

Heading to the slopes?

The hotel's ski concierge has a private lounge, ski and snowboard rentals, iackets and helmets and gear for tuning, repairs and waxing. Explore on foot with guided snowshoe tours through Vail's surrounding White River National Forest. The Sonnenalp is the only valley hotel that has a permit to offer this service, available exclusively to hotel guests.

Dining and drinks

When it's time for lunch, head to the cozy and casual Bully Ranch restaurant, where comfortfood-style apps and entrées (chicken pot pie. burgers, lobster mac & cheese) and desserts fill the menu. Ask for a seat by the window: If you're lucky, you'll spot a justmarried couple taking photos. Through March there's also a themed buffet experience at Ludwig's, The Sonnenalp's new signature restaurant.
